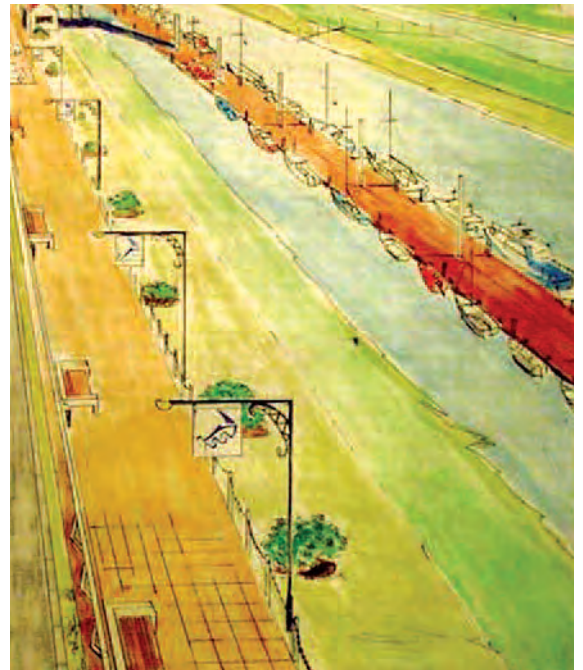
Lighthouse

Planning permission has been granted to build 69 new leisure moorings, a town quay to attract exhibition boats and a promenade that will help transform the waterfront.
